The Generosity of God

This mornings' gospel from Matthew is preceded by a great bold question asked by Peter; "What about us, we have left everything and followed you. What are we to have then?" Jesus said to him, "I tell you solemnly, Everyone who has left father, mother, brother, sister for the sake of my name will receive a hundred times over and also inherit eternal life."

"Many who are first will be last, and the last, first."

Christ goes on then to tell the parable of the Landowner, the workers and the vineyard. This great parable tells us in a dramatic way about the generosity of God. Peter and his companions took a very courageous step in life; they left the familiar life of boats, fishing, companions and many familiar places to search for a new life with the Christ, the Messiah. The new life brought happiness, fulfilment and many challenges. However from time to time there were niggling doubts and questions hence the question, "what about us, we have left everything."

The first lesson from the word of God today is that it is important to put words on our questions. Raising questions provides opportunities for us to learn and in today's gospel Peters' question provides the context for the great teaching on the generosity of God.

The culture and society of the 21st century continually reinforces the correctness of asking the question "what about us, we have left everything ".The culture of the day goes even further and ask " What about me, what is my reward going to be " The world of achievement and success finds it difficult to accommodate the generosity of God. Help us to realise that I do not have to earn or deserve the generosity of God's love in my life, thankfully it is freely available to me twenty four seven.

A.G.M. of the Ballincollig Parish Pastoral Council

Monday September 22 at 7.45pm
 Annex of the Community Hall
 The Parish Pastoral Council is a 30 strong group of Parishioners who hold a shared vision of the Church as a people of God, and together work out a shared vision for the Parish Community. It is a hands on group who help to promote and advertise different events in the parish and are involved in organising these events. The Parish Council communicates and works with parishioners of all ages.
 Meetings are held throughout the year in the Annex of the Community Hall. The A.G.M. is held annually in September. New members are needed at this time and will be facilitated with an introductory session.

Priesthood Education

The annual collection for the Education of Students to the Priesthood takes places next week end Saturday/Sunday September 27th & 28th.
 The Diocese is fortunate in having two priestly ordinations this year. Fr. Ben Hodnett was ordained in June and Reverend Marius O'Reilly will be ordained on the Feast of Christ the King in November. In addition, we have one further Clerical student in the Irish college in Rome and three students in Maynooth. The cost of educating each student for the Priesthood can be as much as €30,000 per year. We expect the Education of Clerical students this year to reach €120,000.
 The Diocese has a number of men training for the Permanent Diaconate. Two have completed the preparatory year, are now commencing formal studies and another has begun the preparatory year.
 This collection is the principal source of funding for the education of our clerical students. This collection has also been used to subvent a number of lay people from the Diocese who are involved in their parishes and are studying Theology as well as funding further study for the priests.

Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week 2014

September 22nd – 28th

The dangers associated with carbon monoxide are promoted to the general public every year through television, radio, press, digital and direct mail advertising. This year, however, in an effort to do something different and to generate greater public engagement on the subject of carbon monoxide, a dedicated Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week is being held from September 22nd to September 28th.

Importantly, the week is aimed at all carbon fuel users.

Remember, Remember, Remember

There are many messages related to the dangers of carbon monoxide that need to be promoted. For Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week, the public are being asked to remember three things that can help protect them against this silent killer using the mnemonic Remember, Remember, Remember;

Remember The causes – Carbon Monoxide can be produced when ANY fuel is burnt, including oil, gas, wood and coal.

Remember To service – To prevent Carbon Monoxide, ensure your appliances are installed and serviced annually by a Registered Gas Installer, a Registered Oil Technician, or a qualified service agent for your fuel type. Also make sure vents, flues and chimneys are kept clear.

Remember The alarm – Carbon Monoxide is odourless and colourless so for added protection install an audible carbon monoxide alarm. Make sure the alarm complies with EN 50291, carries a CE mark, has an end of life indicator and carries an independent certification mark.
