Tenants of God's Vineyard

Today, we celebrate 'Day for Life', a day set aside each year to raise awareness about the meaning and value of human life from conception to death. The Theme this year is: "PROTECT AND CHERISH LIFE". In his message, Pope Francis tells us that being a protector of life is about, "protecting all creation: showing loving concern and respect for every person; ensuring adequate legal protection for the fundamental human right to life; and respecting the environment in which we live. Everything has been entrusted to our protection, and all of us are responsible for it."

Today's readings not only remind us that God entrusts us with the mission to live, celebrate, cherish and protect the life we are given but also invite us to pray for the spirit of cherishing and protecting what God has given us. We hear a parable about tenants in the vineyard. We see the infinite goodness, patience and mercy of God in his dealings with his chosen people and we also see the ingratitude shown by them. As members of the Body of Christ, we are especially privileged to be called to work in the Lord's vineyard. We all have received life from God. As human beings, with all our strengths and failings, we are expected to cultivate and manage this life in such a way that it bears good fruit. We receive God's gifts with a spirit of gratitude and that gratitude leads us to share our gifts, to help others, and to act with justice and integrity. God calls us to be faithful stewards of his creation. The Gospel concludes with the words that the Kingdom of God will be given to a people that produce the fruits of the Kingdom. We pray for the grace to cultivate those fruits in our daily lives.

In our second reading St Paul offers us some comforting words: "There is no need to worry, but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanksgiving, and that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and your thoughts, in Christ Jesus". Many of us are so aware of various challenges in our families. So many today face all sorts of everyday worries relating to many issues, including health and financial issues, as well as bigger fears about the future. Today in Rome, Pope Francis opens the Synod which will discuss some of the challenges facing family life. The theme of this Synod is: 'The pastoral challenges of the family in the context of evangelisation'. Let us pray during these two weeks that all those participating will be open to God's Spirit guiding them in their deliberations.

The prophet Isaiah wants us to listen to what God has done for his chosen people.

St Paul assures us that there is no need to be anxious. God will give us what we need and he will also give us the great gift of peace.

Gospel: Matthew 21:33-43

Using a parable, Jesus got the Jewish leaders to admit their error. He described a vineyard owner (God) who sent slaves (prophets) to collect his share of the harvest from the tenants (Jewish leaders). But the tenants killed the slaves. The landowner sent more slaves, but the tenants killed them, too. Finally the owner sent his son (Jesus). Of course, they killed the son. Jesus summarised his point by telling the chief priests and elders that what they had rejected (their place in the kingdom) would now be given to the Gentiles.


Christ Our Light Roof
