Mission Sunday - "That they may have Life"

This weekend we celebrate World Mission Sunday - a day that unites Catholics all over the world in prayer, celebration and care for the mission of the Church. Over the years, many people from Ireland, including many from our own diocese have been called to serve in the Church's missionary work abroad, especially in the poorest of countries, where they proclaim the Gospel and support the development and growth of young churches throughout the world. "That they may have Life" is the theme for this Mission Sunday. Pope Francis urges Christians: "Be missionaries of God's love, tenderness and mercy". Unfortunately, in our world we see so many suffering because of wars, hunger or a lack of trust between nations, religions and among people. Being missionary is bringing Christ to others. Mission Sunday is a reminder that all of us are called to bring Christ to others in whatever situation or place we find ourselves.

In the first reading we hear of King Cyrus being empowered by God to be his instrument in his divine plan to liberate the Jews, his chosen people. Just as God watched over his people he continues to watch over us today. He never ceases to care for his Church and reminds us that there is no other God besides him and apart from him all is nothing. We too are his anointed ones and he continues to call each one of us by name. In our second reading we have a letter from St Paul to the Christians of Thessalonika in which he praises and thanks God for the witness of their lives in how they have 'shown faith in action, worked for love and persevered through hope in our Lord Jesus Christ' We, today, have the same faith as the Thessalonians. What Christ expected of them, he expects of us too. Does our Christian faith influence and affect all our daily actions? If St. Paul were to write a letter to us today, we would hope that he could thank God also for the ways we have "shown faith in action"; 'worked for love'; and persevered through hope in our Lord Jesus Christ"!

Let us thank God for being blessed with the gift of Faith. We pray for those who have not yet come to know Him and for all missionaries throughout the world who are 'bearers of God's love, tenderness and mercy'.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 45:1, 4-6

In this passage from the prophet Isaiah, God is revealed as the one who calls us by name and gives us the strength we need.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5

Paul reminds his community at Thessalonica that the good news of Jesus is a source of power.

Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20

This Gospel passage contains the great missionary command of go, make disciples, baptise and teach. Jesus has suffered, died and risen for all people. He commands that his disciples bring his kingdom of love, justice and peace to the ends of the earth. They have full authority from him to go and tell. They need not be afraid as he is present with them. They are to demand conversion to the following of Christ and the living out of his teaching. People are not free to choose and select which of his teachings they will follow. He demands all or nothing. One cannot be a disciple and half-heartedly follow Christ

Children's Mass

Just after mass starts, the priest invites the children to come forward to the altar, where he blesses them and sends them with the adult volunteers into the side room at the right of the altar. The children return to the main church at the offertory procession, and then sit at the altar until the sign of peace, when they return to you.
