## **Solemnity of Christ the King – Feast Of Christ The King.**

“I was hungry....., I was thirsty.....,I was a stranger.....,sick....., in prison and you came to see me.”

This weekend we celebrate the feast of Christ the king. And so the Church’s liturgical year draws to a close and the new liturgical year starts next week with Advent.

It is said by the experts that any story of value that is begging to be told should have a good structure with proper emphasis on its beginning, center and end. The idea of story and Kingdom reminds me of a couple of books I read during the summer. Stories about kingdoms, a king and a princess. I found them easy to read and full of useful tips on any journey of discovery a person might like to undertake. Marcia Grad “The Princess who believed in Fairy Tales” and Robert Fisher The Knight in Rusty Amor (Yes, Rusty and not Shining Armor).

Week after week, and time after time the Church lives out and tells the Christian story. Our liturgy with its different colours, images, art, music, song, scripture, prayer focuses on the moment of Incarnation (Advent and Christmas); Suffering, Death and Resurrection (Lent and Easter).

And central to the story is of course the figure of Christ himself. The servant of God, son of God, son of Mary, who entered into the story of humankind and offered it the story of the kingdom of God. From the Christian perspective we are familiar with the word kingdom but I suggest that we could refresh something familiar by pausing and asking: What comes to mind for you when you consider the word kingdom? Is it a kingdom area or territory? Is it a kingdom figure?

Is it toxic? Is it a kingdom place? Is it a castle? Does the kingdom of God, of Christ, of heaven then figure differently? Do you notice a sense of belonging and inclusiveness in the kingdom of upside-down values of service, of forgiveness, of tolerance, of peace to all, of love, of resurrection from the dead?

In God’s wisdom Jesus somehow was mysteriously crowned not just king of the Jews for one day but the king of all for all eternity. The throne of a Cross provided the setting of the request of the repentant one who hung on the Cross – “Jesus remember me in your kingdom” None of us have arrived at the stage whereby Jesus is lord of all that we do and say. In a particular way we ask the Lord to give us a true awareness of His presence in others, in ourselves, and more especially those in any kind need.

**Providing Reliable Tradesmen for Older People**

Unfortunately the last few weeks have seen media reports of older people being ripped off by rogue tradesmen who charge extortionate amounts for work that is never completed. Age Action helps to prevent this type of crime by keeping a list of reliable tradesmen who can provide quotations for jobs and won't rip people off. Regional Manager John O'Mahony says that the list of tradesmen is particularly helpful at this time of year. "People prepare for the winter by getting work done such as boiler services, chimney cleans, gutter clearances, repairs to damaged roof tiles or heating systems. At Age Action we keep a list of reliable tradesmen who will do these jobs at reasonable prices. This ensures that older people won't be ripped off when they employ people to work in their homes." "We also have volunteers who can do smaller jobs for people free of charge. At this time of year we get a lot of requests to put up smoke alarms and to install security locks and chains. This helps people to feel safer during the dark winter evenings. Any older person who would like to have a small job done for them or to employ a tradesman for a bigger job should call us.
