I hope that each of us will receive some reassurance from our Gospel this weekend. Christ had taken the disciples away, "He did not want anyone to know, because He was teaching them." The scene is replicated over and over in our lives. The teacher arrives to school with a great plan for the days' work, but from the word go is struggling to keep the pupils attention; the drama that unfolded on Facebook provides a massive counter attraction. Jesus spoke of the "son of man being delivered into the hands of men, will be put to death and will rise again "heavy stuff and "the disciples did not understand". Hopefully this passage is reassuring for us; there is some excuse for us when his disciples did not understand.

The gospel account goes on; they were haggling among themselves, who will get the number one spot, who will be the boss, who is the most popular. The big question is who will have the influence in this new kingdom?, who is the heir apparent? Who is the front runner to be next leader?.

Jesus is patient with his companions, he sat down, called the twelve to him and said: "Anyone who wants to be a follower of mine, if anyone wants to be first, whoever wants to be most popular "must make himself last of all and servant of all". Spotting the resistance and the disinterest Jesus tries to get their attention by placing a little child in front of them and saying "Anyone who welcomes a little child welcomes me, and anyone who welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me".

Jesus reminds them and us yet again that service is more important than power filled prestige. Like the little child dependant on its parents, we owe all we have to God our Father. This lesson is familiar territory to us but living it and putting it into practice in our lives takes a lifetime. Very often it can be case of one step forward and two steps to the world of power, prestige and popularity. May todays' gospel help us to refocus our efforts?

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Wisdom 2:12. 17-20

People just don't like a prophet. Someone who speaks up, telling the truth, may well be rejected. Holiness does not always lead to happiness. Sometimes, it leads to pain and suffering and death.

Second Reading: James 3:16-4:3

The early Christians were not better than we are. They were just as envious, just as resentful, and just as bitter. Listen now, and hear the remedy.

Gospel: Mark 9:30-37

When people suspect that something bad is about to happen, fear sometimes causes them to stick their heads in the sand and pretend that everything will remain the same. When Jesus tried to tell his disciples about how he would soon suffer and die, they were afraid to ask him any questions. They acted as though everything would stay the same. They even argued about who was the greatest among them. So Jesus corrected them by saying that whoever wanted to be the greatest would have to be the servant of all.

A National Eucharistic Congress will take place at Knock Shrine on Saturday 26th and Sunday 27th September 2015.

The Congress will serve both as a spiritual preparation for the 51st International Eucharistic Congress 2016 in Cebu next January, and as an opportunity to focus in the light of our Eucharistic communion, on some of the important pastoral questions in the life of the Church at the present time. The theme for the National Congress, echoing the theme of IE-C2016, is "Christ, our Hope" (Col 1:27).

The Congress, which is free of charge, will have a particular focus on Marriage and the Family as well as the Year of Consecrated Life and the upcoming Jubilee of Mercy.
