Greenville is a Cork Association for Autism (CAA) Service Centre, where 13 individuals avail of residential care and 10 attend day service. The CAA provides support services to 250 adults with Autistic Spectrum Disorder with centres also located in Midleton, Mogeely and Raffeen. Their Asperger Syndrome Support Service runs from Penrose Wharf in Cork City.

The CAA's horticulture team organise this Christmas Sale every year and welcome members of the public to attend. There will be pottery pieces for sale which have been made by the CAA's clients along with plants which have been grown in Greenville. Tax Rebate


Is a system put in place to help registered charities increase their income. The tax rebate encourages registered charities to claim back tax paid by our donors. This parish being a registered charity is entitled to claim back money from the revenue. To do this we need help. Parishioners are asked to register their name, address and the no of their offertory envelope with the parish office as soon as possible. During the past few years 131 parishioners help the parish in this way.

This system was standardised in 2013 by Revenue. This means that for every tax payer recorded by the parish contributing at least five euro weekly a rebate of 112 euro can be received by the parish annually. Hopefully many others will sign up by adding their name and box no. in the parish office or with sacristans. Literally this is the goose that lays the golden egg please help us to gather up these nuggets of gold.

Age Action Volunteers to put up Christmas Decorations for Older People

Christmas is a wonderful time of the year, but what if you are unable to put up Christmas decorations to give your home that festive feel? "Many older people, particularly those who live alone, cannot easily put up a Christmas tree or other decorations in their homes. Simply getting them down from the attic can be an impossible task" said Age Action Regional Manager John O'Mahony.

"Many older people who have decorated their home every Christmas now find themselves unable to do so. Often people will have relatives calling during the festive season and they would like their home to be decorated for the family visit. Our volunteers will put up Christmas decorations for older people and take them down again in January"

All year round volunteers from Age Action's Care & Repair programme do DIY jobs for older people free of charge. Jobs that volunteers can do include gardening, moving furniture, putting up smoke alarms, small repairs and small painting/decorating jobs.

Mr. O'Mahony continued "The aim of the Care & Repair programme is to help people with tasks around the home that can become difficult as we grow older. Ultimately we want to support people to remain living in their own homes for as long as they wish in increased safety and comfort."
