The context for today's gospel is Christ talking about the evil of scandal and bad example. He said to his disciples "Obstacles are sure to come, but alas for those who provide them. It would be better for them to be thrown into the sea with a stone around their neck, than to lead astray one of these little ones. Watch yourselves."

"If your brother does something wrong and says sorry, forgive him. And if he wrongs you seven times a day and seven times comes back to you and says I am sorry, you must forgive him." Lk 17; 4.

The disciples must have been shattered, difficult enough to forgive once a day but expected to forgive seven times! The disciples had left the familiar to walk with Christ every week their faith is tested. Faith is not an object or a thing but a relationship with God. The expression to lose one's faith as we might lose a key or mobile phone is rather silly. Faith is not something one loses, rather we cease to shape our lives by faith.

Each of us should make the prayer of the apostles our own "Lord increase my faith," because it is not enough to keep the faith, we need to grow in faith. Faith has to grow and as it grows it changes. Faith does not grow static no more than any of our relationships remain static.

Faith grows when exercised, faith also grows through regular nourishment. How do we nourish faith, by prayer and contact with the believing community.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4

In the first reading, Habakkuk cannot understand why God does not intervene to save his chosen people from their enemies. God himself gives the answer: they need faith.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14

In the second reading, Timothy, a bishop in the early Church, is told to bear witness to his faith.

Gospel: Luke 17:5-10

Parents often live this Gospel well. Better than most people, they know what it means to "serve" without expecting a reward. For many, parenthood is reward enough. Jesus explained to the disciples in this passage that service was a requirement of discipleship. When the disciples asked how they could have more faith, Jesus explained that faith was a gift. Faith is not something we control, but only something we can appreciate as a gift from God. To show our appreciation, however, Jesus demonstrated through a lesson of service how we could show our thankfulness to God for the gift of faith. When we share our faith with others and demonstrate it by showing the love of God to those we meet, we proclaim our gratitude.



Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week 2016 - September 26th to October 2nd

The dangers associated with carbon monoxide are promoted to the general public every year through television, radio, press, digital and direct mail advertising. This year, however, in an effort to do something different and to generate greater public engagement on the subject of carbon monoxide, a dedicated Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week began on September 26th and concludes today October 2nd

Importantly, the week was aimed at all carbon fuel users.

Remember, Remember, Remember

There are many messages related to the dangers of carbon monoxide that need to be promoted. For Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week, the public are being asked to remember three things that can help protect them against this silent killer using the mnemonic Remember, Remember, Remember;

Remember The causes – Carbon Monoxide can be produced when ANY fuel is burnt, including oil, gas, wood and coal.

Remember To service – To prevent Carbon Monoxide, ensure your appliances are installed and serviced annually by a Registered Gas Installer, a Registered Oil Technician, or a qualified service agent for your fuel type. Also make sure vents, flues and chimneys are kept clear.

Remember The alarm – Carbon Monoxide is odourless and colourless so for added protection install an audible carbon monoxide alarm.

Make sure the alarm complies with EN 50291, carries a CE mark, has an end of life indicator and carries an independent certification mark.
