THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Genesis 12:1-4
Abram was commanded by the Lord to leave his home and go to a new land. There the Lord God would make of him a great nation and all would be blessed because of him.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:8-10
God saves all people and calls them to a holy life, not because of their own merit but because of the grace held out in Christ. Christ "destroyed death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel."

Gospel: Matthew 17:1-9
The second Sunday of Lent always gives us an account of the transfiguration. Jesus asked Peter, James and John to go with him to the mountain top. While they were there, Jesus was transfigured and became dazzling white before them. Along with Jesus stood Moses and Elijah. The voice of God announced that Jesus was his son and that all should listen to him. The disciples were frightened, but Jesus calmed them. When Peter, James and John looked up, Jesus was the only one left . . . the one to whom we need to listen.

Way of The Cross with Trocaire this Lent

1st Station: Jesus is condemned to death

Scripture: ‘So after they had gathered, Pilate said to them, “Whom do you want me to release for you, Barabbas or Jesus who is called the Messiah?”’ (Matthew 27)

Reflection: Jesus was an innocent person condemned to death. He was abandoned and faced his death sentence alone. Our common home earth is also being condemned to death. Because of our patterns of overconsumption, global temperatures are rising, and plant and animal species are dying off. Whole populations of humanity feel abandoned and left to face the perils of climate change, even death, on their own.

2nd Station: Jesus takes up his cross

Scripture: ‘And carrying the cross by himself, Jesus went out to what is called The Place of the Skull.’ (John 19:17)

Reflection: Jesus was forced to carry his cross, the very instrument of his death, to his crucifixion. There are particular populations of humanity who, like Jesus, are innocent and must carry the burdens of others’ sins. Ethiopia has one of the lowest carbon footprints of any other country in the world, yet suffers severe drought caused by a warming climate.

How can I help someone who's feeling suicidal?

Step-by-step action plan

- ◆ Visit Pieta House There's nothing to worry about when you come to see us. We treat everyone with dignity and respect. And we'll welcome you both warmly. At the first meeting, the person will talk to one of our team over a cup of tea or coffee in a warm and supportive setting. They'll try to identify why the person finds themselves in crisis. On the way home, try not to ask too many questions. We hope you'll see a slight change as the person in crisis gets their first glimpse of light at the end of the tunnel.
- ◆ Stay supportive next, we'll suggest one of our therapists to work with your friend or family member. They'll see the therapist as soon as possible, and then at least twice a week. There's also a therapist on call at weekends, as this can be a difficult time for someone who is feeling suicidal. We'll also advise friends and family on how to offer support. Finally, check in with the person every day over the next couple of weeks. Find out how they're feeling. Some days they may feel great, but other days they might seem very low again. These are quite normal but, if you are worried, contact us. There's nothing to worry about when you come to see us. We treat everyone with dignity and respect, and we never pass judgement. We'll welcome you both warmly. At the first meeting, the person will be invited to have a cup of tea or coffee and talk to one of our team, who will try to identify the reasons behind their self-harm. After their session at Pieta House, take care not to interrogate them about the difficult experiences they've been talking about. Help them by showing kindness and compassion. Don't ever ask to see any wounds or scars and don't check if they're still hurting themselves. (Reach out to Pieta House Cork – let us help. Phone: 021-4341400)
