Fifth Sunday of Lent

Lazarus Restored to Life

Jesus received a message, the message was urgent Lazarus is very sick, "The man you love is sick" Jesus announced "this sickness will bring Glory to God." Jesus stayed put for two more days and then said to his disciples "Let us go to Judaea". We can speculate on what might have been Mary's thoughts as Jesus stood by the grave of her brother Lazarus. THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Ezekiel 37:12-14

The Lord God told the people that soon the graves of the dead would open and they would rise. "I will put my spirit in you that you may live says the Lord."

Second Reading: Romans 8:8-11

"Whoever does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him." God, who raised Jesus from the dead, will raise also those in whom the Spirit dwells.

Gospel: John 11:1-45

In this Gospel, John tells the story of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. The story is significant because it is likely that his action was his last miracle before Jesus began the journey toward his own death. Jesus was called to Bethany to save his friend, but instead waited several days to return. This action confused Lazarus' sisters, Mary and Martha, because they knew that Jesus could have healed their brother. Jesus used the incident to strengthen the faith of Mary, Martha, and all who believed. He made sure that Lazarus was raised from death so that the people could witness God's glory.

9th Station: Jesus falls for the third time

Scripture: ‘Upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed.’ (Isaiah53:5)

Reflection: How can Jesus recover from a third fall? How can farmers suffering a prolonged drought rise up year after year and carry on? Every year, life gets more difficult for Matthew Sibanda. This 66 year old farmer has lived all his life in the Matobo region of southern Zimbabwe, but he says he has never experienced a climate as difficult as in recent years. ‘As far as I remember, I have never experienced such hot temperatures,’ he says. ‘For a long time, my piece of land was considered a fertile wetland which always gave me good yield to feed my family but this is now history.’ (By Nelly Maonde, Zimbabwe Livelihoods & Humanitarian Programme Officer)

10th Station: Jesus is stripped of his garments

Scripture: ‘They divide my clothes among themselves, and for my clothing they cast lots.’ (Psalms 22:18)

Reflection: Jesus suffered the added indignity of being stripped of his garments before the world. The ongoing war in Syria – a war whose root causes are tied to prolonged drought has created 3 million refugees. After losing home, livelihood and land, they are forced to pick up and leave everything. They sometimes suffer the added indignity of being met with hostility and mistrust when they try to find a new country of refuge.

11th Station: Jesus is nailed to the cross

Scripture: ‘When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus.’ (Luke 23:33)

Reflection: So utterly wasted through whipping and bearing the heavy cross, Jesus must still endure the searing pain of being nailed to the cross. What are the physical pains that people endure today that are due to climate change? Around the world there have been many deaths due to extreme heat. The elderly, very young and the sick are those who suffer most. It is estimated that climate change will contribute to two hundred and fifty thousand additional deaths per year.

Traumatic events of War of Independence

Muskerry Local History Society are organising a lecture on some of the traumatic events in the War of Independence era. Tim O'Brien, through a slide show and commentary, will recall the deaths of republican hunger strikers Joe Murphy, Pouladuff, and Michael Fitzgerald, Fermoy, in Cork Jail in 1920; the shooting of the Delany brothers at the family home in Kilbarry, Blackpool on the night of the 'Burning of Cork' and the equally tragic loss of six young Irish lives in an ambush by British armed forces at Ballycannon in the Kerry Pike/Clogheen area. The show will conclude with some photographic coverage of the repatriation from the United States in 1958 of the bodies of Capuchin friars Fr Albert and Fr Dominic who were closely associated with the War of Independence struggle. The lecture will be held in Ballincollig Rugby Club at 8 p.m. on Monday 10 April. Proceeds in aid of Marymount.

and know people from our community.**Celebration of Passover- 2017**

The Passover is a commemoration of the Exodus (flight of the Israelites) out of Egypt as recorded in the Old Testament. It recalls the story of the Israelites being freed from slavery and having to leave Israel in such haste that they did not have time for their dough to leaven and had to eat unleavened bread.

The celebration of the Passover Meal (Sedar) takes place at Eastertime. It is a ritual of 15 parts where symbolic foods are on the table. It is filled with many customs culminating in a prayer that the holiday will be celebrated the following year in Jerusalem.

Here in Ballincollig parish this commemoration is now an annual event. This year it will take place in the old Library section of the Community Hall on Station Road at 7.30pm on Tuesday the 11th April. It takes 1hour approx.

Parishioners are welcome to attend and are required to make prior booking with Miriam in the Parish Office (021 4871206) before Sunday 9th April.
