#### Cedar Tree

The prophet Ezekiel was teaching and encouraging people during their exile in Babylon. Ezekiel was a visionary and full of hope. He reassured people, using the image of little twig from the noble. Under God's guidance the little twig would grow and grow into a great cedar tree. Using the image of the twig Ezekiel imagined a time when God would lead his people from exile to the home of their ancestors.

The second parable is the mustard seed. The Cedar may have been more popular at the time of Jesus. The mustard plant was banned from gardens as it overwhelmed other shrubs. The mustard also took root where it was not welcome. The mustard seed becomes a home and place of shelter and rest for many little birds. Watch out this week and notice glimpses of this "mustard seed" quietly growing.

#### THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading Ezekiel 17:22-24

In this reading the prophet Ezekiel spoke about the better days that were to come for the Chosen People when Yahweh would take back His people once more, and dwell in their midst forever. Today's extract is a messianic prophecy in which God says that he will raise up a descendant—a sprig from the lofty cedar David, who will yet be the glory of Israel.

Second Reading 2 Corinthians 5:6-10
St Paul tells his Corinthians that his constant desire and motive in life is to please God. In this he wants them to imitate him. While on earth this is his aim and when he goes to God in heaven this will be his purpose and his delight.

#### Gospel Mark 4,26-34

The Gospel reading today contains the parable of the mustard seed. This parable, telling of how the smallest of all seeds of the Earth grew into the largest of plants, reminds us that through God's care and blessing great things can grow from even the smallest of efforts. It is important that we place our thoughts, our words, our actions, our ideas and inspirations into God's hands, and that we invite God to bless and to use all of these things for the greater good of the kingdom and for the greater good of the Church on Earth.

#### Permanent Deacons.

Bishop Buckley invites applications from men interested in serving as Permanent Deacons in the Diocese of Cork & Ross. The minimum age for ordination as a permanent deacon is twenty-five years for a celibate man, and thirty-five years for a married man. The maximum age is sixty years. While married men may be ordained, deacons who are widowed may not remarry. The four-year programme of preparation is part-time, as is the subsequent ministry. Initial contact should be as soon as possible as the application process must be completed in June for a course of preparation beginning in September 2018. It is probable that a course will not commence again in Munster until 2021.
