THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: 1 Kings 17:10-16

'Do not be afraid!' Elijah says to the widow. In times of loss, in moments of struggle, on the day when all avenues of escape seem to be closed, we are called to stand firm and remember that God does not abandon his people to death and despair. God will always find a way. Trust in him.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:24-28

Christ does not measure himself out in terms of what he has to spare. He holds nothing back from the Father and he holds nothing back from us. He gives himself totally, once and for all, emptying himself so that we might be filled with the divine life forfeited by our first parents. Christ teaches us how to give so that we may receive the abundance of God's mercy.

Gospel Reading: Mark 12:38-44

If we make a show of holiness we make a mockery of God. It is in the hidden, ordinary acts of love that true heroism is most often shown. If we are lavish in our outward demonstration of piety or charity but have hearts turned in on ourselves, what do we hope to gain? God sees not only our actions but also the intentions which lie behind them and we will be rewarded not so much for how much we give but for how much it costs us to give. The more we hold on to, the less free we are to move forward. They achieve holiness who dare to risk everything for God.

Sam Maguire, The Man and the Cup

Kieran Connolly will present a lecture on Sam Maguire: The Man & The Cup on Monday, 12 November in Ballincollig Rugby Club. Originally from a Church of Ireland family in west Cork, Sam Maguire played a leading role in the GAA and the Irish Republican Brotherhood (IRB) in London before and during the War of Independence in 1919–1921 when he was the main agent of Michael Collins in London. This will be fascinating talk as Kieran has written the latest biography of Sam Maguire. The talk will be preceded at 7.30 pm by the launch of Times Past, 2017-18, the journal of Muskerry Local History Society, by Michael O'Flynn.
