#### THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Ecclesiasticus 27:4-7
The Book called Ecclesiasticus or Ben Sira is not part of the Hebrew Bible. When the Hebrew Bible was translated into Greek some extra material was included. Among this material are seven books, of which this is one. Today's reading contains some short sayings. One of these refers to the quality of a tree being rated by the quality of its fruit. It is likely that Jesus encountered these proverbs and this book. If so, it's easy to see how they helped to shape his own teaching.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:54-58
This is the final section from Chapter 15 of Paul's first letter to the Christians at Corinth. He has been saying that resurrection does not mean returning to the physical body we have now. Here he concludes by stating that we shall be changed so that we shall have a new, spiritual body that carries the image of the heavenly Christ.

Gospel: Luke 6:39-45

Today's Gospel is the final excerpt from the Sermon on the Plain. There are two themes in this section: on judging others and a test of goodness. The point of comparison of the three pairs of people who appear as examples here - namely, two blind people, a disciple and a teacher and two siblings - is to emphasise their equality. That is to say, in each case neither is superior to the other and so, neither one can afford to presume to correct the faults of the other.


