THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading:Amos 7:12-15 Amos will rather listen to God than to the king. He did not choose to be a prophet. The call came to him from God. Therefore he will preach the message whether it is pleasing to the king or not. The king may threaten him, but cannot silence him.
