Bishop Fintan Gavin

Bishop Fintan Gavin was appointed Bishop of Cork and Ross on 8 April 2019 by Pope Francis. His episcopal ordination took place in the Cathedral of St Mary and St Anne on 30th June 2019.

Fintan Gavin was born in Dublin on 1 January 1966 and educated

at Scoil Mhuire, CBS, Boys National School, and Ardscoil Rís, CBS, in Marino. He studied for the priesthood at Holy Cross College, Clonliffe, and University College Dublin.

During his priestly formation, Gavin trained at SIPTU Liberty Hall, Dublin, at the Northlands addiction treatment-counselling centre and at Saint Patrick's Hospital, Mental Health Services,

James Street, Dublin.

Following ordination in 1991 and graduation, while working as a priest in the Diocese of Dublin, Gavin was a schoolteacher in Bray, County Wicklow.

Gavin earned a licentiate and a doctorate in canon law at the Pontifical Gregorian University and is fluent in Italian and Spanish.

Bishop Fintan is prioritising meetings and getting to know the people of the diocese. He is conducting a pastoral visit to Ballincollig this weekend the 15th, 16th & 17th November. Bishop Fenton will visit primary schools on Friday 15th, meet with Parishioners at 2pm on Saturday 16th in the community hall, will celebrate the 6pm vigil Mass in St. Mary & St, John and conclude with the 11am & 12:30 pm Masses on Sunday 17th in Christ Our Light.

From Muskerry to the Front

On 23 September 2019 members of the Muskerry Local History Society and some friends travelled to Belgium and France on a tour of the battlefields and monuments of the First World War that was led by military historian Gerry White. For all involved this would be a journey of remembrance. Among the many famous sites associated with the war were the Menin Gate, the Thiepval Memorial, the site of the icon painting, 'The Last General Absolution of the Munsters' at the Rue du Bois, and Compiègne in France where the armistice that ended the war was signed. A number of people also made a pilgrimage to a grave of a relative who died in the war. On Monday, 18 November, Gerry White will give a presentation on the tour that will include photographs and information on many of the WWI sites that were visited. The lecture will be held in Ballincollig Rugby Club, beginning at 8.00 pm

Charitable Donation Scheme

The Charitable Donation Scheme allows tax relief on qualifying donations made to eligible charities and approved bodies.

If an individual makes a donation of over €250 in the year, the charity or approved body can claim a refund of tax paid on that donation by the donor.

If a company makes a donation of over €250 in the year, the company can claim a tax deduction as if the donation was a trading expense.

There is a four year time limit for making a claim under this scheme


