Taizé – Life in the Spirit

A couple of weeks ago, I travelled to Taizé in France with a group of 5th Year students. It's a place which many people in Ballincollig and environs have heard about through the late Father George O'Mahony PP. For several years, he brought groups of young people there to experience a time of prayer and reflection, and to meet hundreds of other young people from across Europe who were likewise exploring their faith. It was my first time there and it was a special experience that moved me greatly. I can also assure you it was a real pilgrimage! Our accommodation consisted of bunk beds and the food was practically vegetarian, consumed from a plastic bowl and with a spoon! Each day, we prayed with the brothers three times a day, using their famous Taizé chants, had Bible reflection, and everyone found a job to do. I was preparing picnics while others cooked or cleaned or mended benches.

What amazed me was how content people felt; the simplicity of our time there helped everyone to unburden and have deeper conversations with each other or in prayer. With fewer distractions, everyone, young and old, felt free to be themselves. That might sound like a platitude, but in fact it can be rare in a world of rush and constant comparison. I'm hopeful to bring groups from Ballincollig there, beginning next year. Father George has left us a great legacy: let's continue to build on it.

In other news, the parish is hosting a 'Life in the Spirit' seminar, beginning the evening of Friday May 10th in the Church of Christ Our Light. This is a 6-week course for those who would like to explore further their faith or perhaps reawaken a dormant faith. Pope Francis has asked that every parish run this course, so we are very pleased to be able to offer it here. More details to follow here and at the Sunday Masses.

THE SUNDAY READINGS

First Reading: Acts 9: 26-31

When St. Stephen was stoned to death because of his preaching Paul (then known as Saul) was in charge of the execution. Now, however, after his conversion on the road to Damascus, he returns to Jerusalem and takes up where Stephen left off: preaching the same message. Again this preaching arouses the same fury and the Disciples, fearing for his life, sent him away to his home town of Tarsus.

Second Reading: 1 John 3: 18-24

Love of God and of the neighbour are inseparable. In practising either we must not rest satisfied with expressions of devotion and good will. Only when charity is active does conscience assure us that we are leading sincere Christian lives. Two things sum up what is most pleasing to God; faith in the divine personality of Jesus Christ and brotherly love according to Christ's instructions.

Gospel: John 15: 1-8

In this allegory the cultivation of the vine is attributed to God the Father. A fruitless branch is lopped off like Judas. The pruning clean of the Apostles is the result of the words Jesus spoke to them. A separated vine branch is useless. It is destined for the fire. Fruitfulness and discipleship go together.
