## My Trip to Gougane

Every few months, I like to take a trip back to Gougane Barra. I'll pray in the Oratory and then walk through Gougane Barra Forest Park. I always feel like I'm somehow 'returning to the sources' when I'm there. Not only is it the origin of our diocese of Cork, it's also where the river Lee rises. I see the Lee's gentle streams and rivulets cascade from on high and I think of how this very water will flow to the ocean, passing by Ballincollig in the meantime.

To see the tiny streams at Gougane always makes me think of the origins of my vocation, on why I became a priest in Cork and Ross. Similarly, a married couple could think back to those moments when they first met and embarked on their marital journey together. Or, again, a teacher could remember what spurred them to teach in the first place.

To return to the sources is not just necessary but can be quite therapeutic (so long as we don't become trapped by the past). For me, looking to our yesterday informs our today and is a rejuvenating experience.

In November, we do a lot of looking back by remembering our dead. From November 2nd to 10th, we'll have our annual Novena for the Dead, with the Candle Mass for those who've died over the past 12 months celebrated on Friday 8th of November at 19:30 in Saint Mary and Saint John's. It's always a special moment when we look back to remember, pray, and give thanks. But we never just look back. To pray for our dead also demands of us that we each ask ourselves how we can honour this person's memory and what can we learn from them that has made a difference to our lives, that has made us who we are today? This, for me, has made the tradition of praying for the dead far more of a dynamic experience.
