We Honour Saints Brigid & Blaise this Long Weekend

January is a month most of 'get through' before longer days and green shoots come our way again in the spring. The Feast of Saint Brigid marked the beginning of the new season on Saturday, thanks be to God. Our waiting has not been in vain. Even if it's still cold, we can feel a growing warmth to the gentle sunshine.

This Sunday, however, marks forty days since Christmas. On it, we celebrate the Presentation of the Lord, or 'Candlemas'. As we hear in the gospel, in presenting him at the Temple, Joseph and Mary are fulfilling the Jewish law. To most people present in Jerusalem, it was like any other day, except for Simeon and Anna, two wise and holy people who had a felt knowledge that something was different. The Lord had indeed entered his Temple.

For us, Simeon and Anna offer the example of a spiritual sensitivity, of which we are all capable. They were able to recognise God in their midst, while others were oblivious. They had waited a long time for this moment, but their waiting wasn't in vain and they never gave up hope. They might stand as examples to us today of holding steadfast and not giving up. As winter turns to spring, we look ahead to a time of new growth in the parish: Alpha Youth begins in the Carraig Centre on Wednesday 5th of February at 20:00; a Week of Guided Prayer will be taking place in the second week of March; a group from the Family of Parishes (Ballincollig, Ballinora, Ovens/Farran) will join together for three listening sessions as part of Bishop Fintan's 'Year of Prayer, Listening, and Discernment'; there will be a Family of Parishes liturgy with anointing of the sick in Ballinora on Tuesday 25th of February; and some of our young adult parishioners will be travelling to Rome for the Jubilee World Youth Day in the summer. In the meantime, those in sixth classes across the local schools will be making their Confirmations in the coming weeks, and the new Parish Office is taking shape at the front of the John Paul II Community Centre.

I hope you have a very enjoyable Bank Holiday weekend.

Jubilee of Youth Pilgrimage to Rome Launch

Bishop Fintan will lead a group of fifty young people (18 to 30 years) to Rome this summer from the 28th July to the 4th August for Jubilee of Youth Pilgrimage. It is a once in a life opportunity for our young people to not only meet the Pope, to experience the Eternal City, but also to be encouraged and inspired as they meet other young people of faith from all continents. Hundreds of thousands of young people are expected to travel and to experience this Jubilee Celebration, which only happens every twenty five years in the Church. The pilgrimage will cost €550 per person (plus fundraising) and will include seven nights half board at the Irish College, Travel Insurance, a 20Kg bag, and a pilgrim kit. There will be a special Launch Evening on Thursday 6th February at 7.30pm in Mardyke House (T12 W8RP).

Reflection for Parents



How many times do we react to what appears to be the situation? A few times of being wrong slows parents down and teaches us that "things are not always as they seem." It takes time and often forces us to "eat humble pie" (or at least laugh at ourselves), but very often, by the time we "get the story" we recognize that we have come to the wrong conclusion, that the evidence is misleading. We need to show our children that we trust and have faith in them. If our first impression turns out to be correct, then we can take necessary disciplinary steps, but at least our children recognize our faith in them as our first response.

First Reading: Malachi 3: 1-4

God's people were complaining that their oppressors were prospering while they were left to suffer. "If God is just", they asked. "Where is He?" God answers that he will come but that they are not fit to receive his coming. He will have to purify them like gold is purified in fire before they will be fit to serve the Lord.

Second Reading: Hebrews 2: 14-18

Christ did not come to help immortal angels but mortal men. As helper of mortals he had to resemble them in every possible way so as to become merciful by partnership in misery. Experience of suffering and of trial is the best school of compassion. Knowing pain and trial, Christ is a competent helper of those who are being tried.

Gospel: Luke 2: 22-40

As in the case of the birth of Jesus the narrative of Luke is marked with great simplicity. The precise prescriptions of the Law are followed. As the firstborn, Jesus is God's property, consecrated to God as in a sacrifice. Mary offers what was known as "the poor woman's sacrifice": two young pigeons. The future of the Child is foretold by the two old people, Simeon and Anna. Luke, in one brief le sentence, passes over the first twelve years of the life of Jesus: "he grew to maturity and he was filled with wisdom; and God's favour was with him.
