Part of the great revelation of the New Testament is the notion that God is coming among us to make all things new; that means removing all the causes of guilt and grief in human life. We show our acceptance of this renewal of our lives by our love for one another.

"Love One Another, Just As I Have Loved You"

In today's Gospel Jesus is telling his disciples that he will not be with them much longer. Judas Iscariot has just left them to go out and betray Jesus. Jesus, knowing his death is imminent, says: 'now has the Son of Man been glorified and in him God has been glorified'. He then gives his disciples a new commandment to 'love one another just as I have loved you'-'by this love you have for one another, everyone will know that you are my disciples'. Just before this Jesus had given them an example of love in action when he washed their feet. This commandment to love one another is central to our Christian life. The love that we have for others is a reflection of the love that we have for God. Jesus loved even when others didn't love him in return. As we all know, it is not easy to keep on loving those who let us down or turn their back on us. Two of Jesus' closest friends did just that Judas Iscariot betrayed him by handing him over to the authorities to be arrested; Peter denied even knowing him. Yet Jesus laid down his life out of his great love for them and for us. We continue to see the glory of God reflected in the lives of those who live out his commandment of love.

During the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles we see the great love of Paul and Barnabas as they continue on their mission from town to town, supporting and encouraging the followers of Jesus to persevere in the faith. They remind us that to reach Heaven is not easy; that 'we all have to experience many hardships before we enter the kingdom of God'. In the Book of the Apocalypse, St John tells us about his vision of a new heaven and a new earth described in today's second reading as the 'New Jerusalem'. St John gives us a picture of what heaven will be like - here God, who lives among his people, 'will wipe away all tears from their eyes, there will be no more death and no more mourning or sadness' and God will make his home among them. One of the greatest things we could hope for one another is that one day we will all be welcomed in to God's eternal home.

It is in our daily personal relationship with God, that we receive the necessary graces to face the hardships we encounter as we journey toward his Kingdom of love. We pray that the love of God within each one of us may shine forth on all whom we meet on our daily journey.
