Come Holy Spirit

Today, the Feast of Pentecost, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles who were gathered together in Jerusalem. On that first Pentecost, having heard the disciples speak in their own languages about the marvels of God, many people became believers. Ever since then, the Gospel message has been proclaimed throughout the world. As members of Christ's body we too are called to witness to God's life-giving Spirit dwelling in each one of us. In our parish many times during the year we experience joy and hope at witnessing children affirming their faith in God through the Sacrament of Confirmation; we experience it when parents bring their child for Baptism and when children come to the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Eucharist for the first time. Every time we gather around the Table of the Lord to celebrate the Eucharist we renew our faith and receive the nourishment of Word and Sacrament which strengthens us in our Mission.

Am I open to God's Spirit guiding my daily life? We pray for the grace to be open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit and to recognize not only how the Spirit has gifted us in individual ways, but also to appreciate the Spirit's different gifts in other people. May we live out in our lives the fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness and self-control.

In the two second readings for this weekend, St Paul reminds us that 'everyone moved by the Spirit is a child of God and since the Spirit of God has made his home in us, we are heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory'. We are also reminded that 'the Spirit comes to help us in our weakness. For when we cannot choose words in order to prayer properly, the Spirit himself expresses our pleas in a way that could never be put into words - for God knows everything in our hearts'.

Let us pray today for ourselves and the entire Church that we may all be renewed by the power of the Holy Spirit. We pray too that the Holy Spirit will enlighten all those in our Parish who are preparing for Examinations. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in us the fire of your love!

The Procession will leave the church of St. Mary & St. John immediately after the 6pm Vigil Mass (approx. 6.40pm) and proceed down Station Road, on to the Main Street as far as Bank of Ireland, turn right down to the Ballincollig Credit Union and back to Church View for Benediction. You and your family are invited to take part in the Eucharistic Procession. Families of children who received their First Holy Communion and who celebrated the sacrament of Confirmation recently are especially invited to take part.

Reflection for Parents

Our children often come to us frightened about one thing or another. It is our job to calm their fears and generally we do a pretty good job. But sometimes, our doubts or concerns are the same as theirs. When this happens, we're not always sure how to answer them and after reading today's Gospel we may think that our faith is not strong enough. But doubt does not necessarily mean a lack of faith. Sometimes the best thing we can do is tell our children we wonder about the same things they do and then together think about how our faith helps us answer the concern. Generally, these conversations revolve around a serious illness or death in the family and what happens when we die. It's not "lack of faith" that causes us to not know. It is a "lack of knowledge," because it's true, none of us knows exactly.

First Reading: Acts: 2:1-11

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Second Reading: Rom. 8:8-17

We are always faced with the choice between following our nobler or our meaner instincts in the conduct of our day-to-day lives. Paul calls this living according to the Spirit or living according to the flesh - and then he suggests that the most vital, life-giving choice we can make is to let the Holy Spirit be our guiding light.

Gospel: John 14:15-16, 23-26

If we obey god's commandments then we will be given the Holy Spirit and he will abide in us for ever. Jesus was saying that the Holy Spirit will be in us forever if we continue to obey god's commandments for our lifetime. God always travels with his people. We pray today for a new outpouring, come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of our faithful.
