Feast of the Holy Trinity

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity. The Mystery of the Trinity is the Mystery of God's Love - the love of the Father who created us and sustains us; the love of his Son Jesus, who humbled himself to become one of us and who died on the Cross to redeem us; and the love of the Spirit, who lives within us and who knows our struggles and helps us to pray. St John tells us in today's Gospel the Holy Spirit is the Spirit of Truth who will guide us to the complete truth. All through our life, God is with us. When we sign ourselves in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, we invite God's protection and presence, and we remind ourselves of the God of love in whose image we are created.

In today's second reading, we hear how the glory of God is reflected in the peace that Jesus brings and in the love that the Spirit brings. When we are in right relationship with God, we experience peace in our lives. We place our trust in Christ's promise relying not on our own strength but on the help of the Holy Spirit. St Paul writes: 'suffering brings patience, patience brings perseverance, and perseverance brings hope'. Our hope rests in the love of God which has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit and we look forward in hope to sharing in God's glory. The first reading from the Book of Proverbs celebrates the beauty and wisdom of God's creation where everything has its purpose and its place. Reflecting on the wonders of God's creation that is all around us, we give praise and thanks to God.

As Christians each one of us was baptized "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". We all like to have a sense of belonging and we need the love, support and friendship of others in our Christian community. We belong to the family of God by the very fact we were born in the image and likeness of God and when we were baptized we became sons and daughters of God. Jesus is the Son of God, and we are also a son or daughter of God. Maybe we don't think of each other often enough as sons and daughters of God, and as 'brothers and sisters'!

Ballincollig Parish Eucharistic Procession

The Ballincollig annual Eucharistic Procession will take place next Saturday 21st June. The Procession will leave the church of St. Mary & St. John immediately after the 6pm Vigil Mass (approx. 6.40pm) and proceed down Station Road, on to the Main Street as far as Bank of Ireland, turn right down to the Ballincollig Credit Union and back to Church View for Benediction. You and your family are invited to take part in the Eucharistic Procession. Families of children who received their First Holy Communion and who celebrated the sacrament of Confirmation recently are especially invited to take part.

First Reading: Prov. 8:22-31

Wisdom is an attribute of God. The Book of Proverbs identifies God with the Wisdom, which existed before the world was created.

Second Reading: Rom. 5:1-5

St. Paul reminds us that the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit.

Gospel: John 16:12-15

While the term "Trinity" is more the result of early Christian communities than it is scripture, today's Gospel helps us see the interconnectedness of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This Gospel reveals Jesus' words at the Last Supper. The disciples could not understand the meaning of Jesus' words because they had not yet witnessed the resurrection. But Jesus explained that everything he had taught them and the witness he bore was from the Father. He assured them that he and the Spirit were one and that the Spirit spoke only what had been told by the Father through Jesus? The Spirit would remain with the community until Jesus returned in glory.

Eucharistic Procession

Please join us for the 99th Eucharistic Procession which takes place on Sunday, June 22nd leaving the Cathedral of St. Mary and St. Anne at 3.00pm. It would be great to continue the tradition of parishioners from parishes throughout the city and beyond to walk in the procession. Parking is available in the grounds of St. Anthony's Convent, St. Mary's Road (across from the Cathedral). This year to accommodate the growing large numbers it was decided to take the final prayer and Benediction outside onto a specially constructed platform down at the end of Grand Parade near the National Monument.
