World Mission Sunday - "Missionaries of Hope Among All Peoples"

The Society for the Propagation of the Faith was founded in 1822 by a French laywoman, Pauline Jaricot. She wished to help not only French missions and missionaries but all missions and missionaries especially the poorest. In 1922 The Society for the Propagation of the Faith became the primary organisation of the Church for supporting the activity of the missionaries. Pope Pius X1 instituted Mission Sunday in 1926 and ordered that it be observed in all churches and oratories throughout the world as a day of prayer and material support for missionary activity.

It was Pauline who drew up the basic plan of the Society. It is one of prayer, offering up of suffering and making a financial contribution for the spread of the Faith. This year the motto chosen is "Make His Face Shine". "Holiness and mission are inescapable aspects of the vocation of every Baptised person. The commitment to become more holy is clearly linked to that of spreading the message of salvation. Every member of the faithful is called to holiness and to mission."

Mission is not over. Many of the young churches evangelised are now producing missionaries to other young churches. Many of these Young Churches are rich in vocations but poor in financial resources. All financial contributions for Mission Sunday go directly to the Missions. It assists missionaries to" Make his face shine "before the millions who have never had the opportunity to hear about or see the face of Christ

Urgent Appeal for Blood Donations

The Irish Blood Transfusion Service has issued an urgent appeal for blood donors as national supplies have fallen to critically low levels, with stocks across most blood groups now under three days.

Despite strong collection numbers over the past two months, a combination of high hospital demand and increasing respiratory illness in the community has severely impacted blood donation rates. The IBTS is now calling on the public to help restore supplies to safe levels.

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8

Like a relentless child, the widow in Jesus' parable wouldn't give up. She continually begged the judge for justice against her opponents. Not because the judge wanted to see justice done, but because he grew tired of the woman's pleading, he granted her request. The point Jesus wanted to make with this story is how much our loving God will answer our prayers if we persist in our asking.
