Advent Reconciliation Service – a Time to Rejoice?

Recently, I had the great privilege of attending Coláiste Choilm's TY production of *Beauty and the Beast*. Tickets go quicker than for All-Ireland finals, so I'm indebted to be on the receiving end of one (thank you, Ms Sliney!). As ever, it was a magnetising œuvre of familiar songs, sweeping choreography, stage management, and great acting. Such is the exuberant level of talent that a different TY student played the main character, Belle, on each of the four nights. Well done to all involved!

What also happened to capture my attention was some off-stage moments. From my seat, I could see the parents of some of the cast, many of whom are familiar to me from the parish. To observe them observing their son/daughter in full flight was a real delight. The parents' seraphic faces radiated joy, amazement, and wonder, all tinged with an oozing pride. I could well imagine they were thinking that it only seemed like a short while ago that they brought their child into the world, watched them take their first steps, and sent them off to school. And here they are watching them take command of a stage and hold the attention of a full auditorium. It made me wonder. If this is how a parent can look upon their child, how might God look upon us, his sons and daughters in Christ? It's a question I've come back to again and again over the years: what does God think when He thinks of me? In these final weeks before

Christmas, now might be an opportune time to ask ourselves the same question.

The story of the *Prodigal son*, told us by Jesus, is one that imparts to us an image of God as a caring father, as one with a gentle and forgiving heart, as one who delights in us, and who rejoices when we turn to him. I think if we take this to heart, it leaves us in the sure knowledge that we can return to God whenever, wherever, and however we may find ourselves, if indeed we feel we've drifted a bit. One way by which we are invited to do this is to experience the healing mercy of God through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, which

will take place this Monday the 15th at 7:30 pm in the church of Christ Our Light, with our **Advent Reconciliation Service**.

Trusting in our relationship with God, may we come to this moment 'shouting for joy, everlasting joy on [our] faces' (see Isaiah 35:10).

I hope you enjoy these final weeks of Advent.
