The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

At this stage, the phrase 'It's all over for another year' has probably been uttered time and again, and even itself seems dated. But Christmas only really began on Christmas Day and we celebrate the Christmas season or Christmastide in these days that follow. The Church's liturgical tradition (how we pray) urges us to wean ourselves only gradually off the Christmas spirit. We celebrate a Christmas Octave up to and including the 1st of January, while also marking the famous Twelve Days of Christmas, to bring us up to the Feast of the Epiphany on January 6th. Given that Christmas preparations may have begun in November, it's not hard to understand why many people take the decorations down before the 6th, but this would be like sending people home from a dinner party without dessert. So, here are some ideas on how to mark the feast days over Christmastide:

28 December: Feast of the Holy Family: make an extra effort to spend dedicated time with family. A no-phone walk through the Regional Park, for example.

01 January: Feast of Mary, Mother of God: pray the rosary or light a candle at the Marian shrine in either of the churches, asking Mary's help for 2026.

06 January: Feast of the Epiphany: think of the ways you could help a charity or someone in need; perhaps unwanted gifts could find a deserving home.

These are just some possible aids. I hope one and all celebrated a joyful Christmas. And may anno Domini 2026 bring you good health and a deeper relationship with the Lord. Fr. Ronan Sheehan CC

Reflection for Parents

We may not always be as successful as we would like, but as parents we try to create some stability for our children. It must have been hard for Mary and Joseph to bring their child into the world in such a hurried and rustic environment. Barely had the child been born and visited by the magi, when the Holy Family made a late-night escape through unfamiliar territory to an even more unfamiliar land they would call home until Herod died. At the news of Herod's death, Joseph moved his young family back to Israel, but to a still different place from where he called home. The movement of our lives may not be as dramatic and life-threatening as that of the Holy Family, but it surely helps us to know that the presence of God is the one continuous thread that binds us together no matter where we are.

First Reading: Ecclesiasticus 3:2-6, 12-14

The first Scripture reading represents the wisdom of the Old Testament regarding family life. We are told that he who honours his father and mother will be blest in this life and in the next. What was true in Old Testament times is true in our age also.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:12-21 or 3:12-17 In the second reading, Paul tells us that Jesus shares our human nature. Because of that fact, we are his brothers and sisters. Therefore, with him, we are sons and daughters of God our Father.

Gospel: Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23.

When the magi left the Holy Family in Bethlehem, Joseph was warned in a dream to take Mary and Jesus into Egypt because Herod was looking to destroy the child. Following Herod's death, another angel appeared to Joseph in a dream and informed him that it was now safe to return to Israel. Joseph took his family to the Galilee area and settled in Nazareth.
