St Brigid, Abbess, Secondary Patron of Ireland

Blessed are they who live the Beatitudes. They are blessed and know what makes true happiness. Blessed are they who are poor in spirit, leaving space and time for God in their lives, blessed are they who are gentle and kind, merciful and pure in heart. Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for justice, who work for peace. And blessed are they who suffer for Christ.

Brigid lived the Beatitudes. Born around the year 454 at Faughart, she followed her calling to consecrate her life to God. Tutored by Mel in Ardagh, she fostered that calling in many others. With Conleth, she founded the double monastery of Kildare. The interior spiritual life was given countless expression in a life marked by welcome of the stranger and hospitality to all, in her care for the sick and the poor, and in her concern for animals, nature and the Earth.

Brigid died on 1st February 524 and is buried in Downpatrick, with the other two patrons of Ireland, Patrick and Columba (Colmcille).

The first day of February is also the date of the Celtic festival of Imbolc, the beginning of a new season of hope and growth.

Brigid's reputation spread throughout Ireland and in many parts of Europe. The legend of her cloak expanding to meet the needs of her monastery, highlights the power of this fourth/fifth-century woman. The Brigid's Cross, woven from rushes, expressed her Christian faith and God's concern and protection given to us through the | prayers and intercession of Brigid.

The public holiday tomorrow is linked with the feast of our patron saint. It was established as a recognition of the enormous sacrifices made by our people and by frontline workers during the Covid 19 pandemic. With St Brigid we remember those who died, all who suffered in so many ways, and those who still suffer, and we express our gratitude to those who, like St Brigid, gave guidance, care and comfort.

World Day of the Sick 11th February 2026

Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes

Sickness comes to all our homes unless we are extremely lucky. Most of us have experienced sleepless nights at one time or another; a sick baby, child, parent, awaiting test results, visit to a GP, consultant or the serious illness of extended family or friends. You may be a carer for someone with special needs, chronic illness or in the Medical Profession. Each year the church sets aside the 11th February, Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, as a special day of prayer for the Sick. In our family of Parishes, Ballinora, Farran and Ovens have had the opportunity to celebrate World Day of the Sick and host the Sacrament of the Sick over the last three years. This year it will be Celebrated in Christ Our Light Church in Ballincollig, where we will have the opportunity to pray for the sick and receive the Sacrament of the Sick.

For anyone with a serious illness, those who are infirm, in advanced years, or anyone prior to surgery, maybe someone struggling with addiction and obviously anyone in danger of death, the words of blessing over the oil say it all. It is "oil intended to ease the sufferings of your people". Oil soothes and heals. Oil blessed for the Sick is a sign of the Anointed One (Messiah) of God. The oil that is used is Olive Oil. The Bishop and priests bless it at the "Chrism Mass on Holy Thursday in the Cathedral. The Holy Oils are taken back to each parish for use during the following 12 months. A person is anointed on the forehead and the palms of the hands while the priest says: "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you by the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the lord who heals you, save you and raise you up"
